Kari is pleased to have been a host on PBS television's *Love of Quilting*, nominated as "Best Teacher/Instructor", "Best Quilt Book Author" and is proud to be a BERNINA Ambassador.

As a recycled Home-Ec teacher, she still finds teaching exciting. Only now, Kari gets to teach quilters from all over the nation.

Collage Appliqué Class

This class will be held on 2 separate Tuesday evenings; April 30th and May 7th from 5-9 pm at Salem Lutheran Church in St. Cloud. Melanie Schatz-Pattay will be teaching this technique so that participants will be able to create a vibrant wall hanging either from a kit or from your own pattern and fabric. Kits are available from Gruber's and she recommends starting with either the "Fiona the Featherweight" kit by Joan Cain, which makes a 28.5" by 27" wall hanging and costs \$57.50 or "Pincushion" which measures 41"x 45". The "Pincushion" pattern is \$30.25. A kit is yet to be developed for this pattern. Other kits are available, however, and you may choose what you'd like to make. The class is limited to 20 participants. The fee for the class is \$35. Make checks payable to SCHQG. There will be a sign-up sheet at the April meeting.

<p>The April guild meeting, April 4, will be the final sign-up day for our 2019 Mystery Quilt. Cost is \$3 (for the year) per participant to cover the fee for the designer and copying costs. The quilt is Beginner+ in difficulty and can be made in lap, lap+, twin, and twin+ sizes, depending on borders that can be added. This is not a Block of the Month. It is a Clue of the Month. April's clue will be your fabric requirements. This is a 3 fabric quilt: light, medium, and dark. Your choice of colorway- it can be monochromatic (example: light blue, cadet blue, navy) or varied. I've been previewing the clues and my fabrics are a white background light print, a gray background with a medium print, and a bright teal with a bold print. I bought hot pink to make mine twin+ with the borders. If you have not already signed up please bring your \$3 (or a check) to the April meeting. Everyone who has signed up by April 4 will get their fabric clue that evening and a new clue every month for a year. Sign-ups after the April meeting will be \$10 because you've had plenty of notice and I don't want to have to keep making copies of the clues ;)</p> <p>Featherweight Group - This group does fun projects throughout the year. To be part of this group, you must own and bring a Featherweight sewing machine. Julie Johnson is the facilitator. Our raffle quilt, “Pearls of the Sea” was unveiled to thunderous applause at the March meeting. Chris Hoover volunteered to design the quilt; but said she didn’t have time to do the piecing. After the design was complete, she wanted to piece it herself because she liked it so much. It was beautifully quilted by Tom Kremer. The colors, fabrics, and design of the quilt evoke images of the sea. Likewise, the quilting features circles and swirls mimicking pearls and movement of the sea waters. Please thank Chris and Tom for their work.

At the meeting, we also introduced the quilt show committee. Two members were missing that we forgot to mention: Pam Rickbeil is taking care of Admissions, and Teri Olson is in charge of the quilt display. The committee is meeting every month before our guild meeting so you will always have the latest information as decisions are being made. There is so much more to come in the next six months . . .

The committee has selected **Tom Kremer** as our **Featured Quilter**.

Barb and Marjorie have issued a Co-Chair challenge: Make a small quilt up to 36” x 36” that follows the theme of the show, “Pins to Pearls”. The size limit means that it could be a wall hanging, table topper, or a lap quilt. It can be either square or rectangular. Ideas to spark your creativity: pins, pincushions, safety pins, pearls, pearls on safety pins, sea, ocean, shells, sandy beach, quilt blocks such as Ocean Waves or Storm At Sea, or fabric featuring any of these images. One ribbon will be awarded to the quilt that best illustrates the theme.

Board Meeting Minutes – March 7, 2019

Meeting was called to order at 6:15 p.m. by President Sandy Anderson. Minutes of the January 3, 2019 meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

BOARD REPORTS:

President (Sandy Anderson): Sandy announced that she is still looking for a President-elect for 2019.

Membership (Julie Johnson): The guild currently has 105 members.

Special Events (Alice Sue Becker): The next Sip, Sew and Swap event will be March 19th from 6-9 pm at Alice Sue's home. Small Groups (Karen Cyson): The guild is offering a mystery quilt for 2019. Sign-ups will start at tonight's meeting. Cost is \$3 per member.
