**President's Challenge 2020****Chris Hoover****It's all about the NUMBERS!**

I'm a numbers person. By that I mean that I constantly seem to have numbers running through my head. I tend to count how many pieces I have yet to sew, how many pieces there are in each block, how much longer it's going to take me (in minutes/hours) to finish the binding, etc. And that's just numbers I think about when I'm quilting! So my quilt challenge to you had to be about the numbers – 2020.

The rules for this challenge are:

- The quilt must finish at 20" x 20".
- The quilt must contain the two fabrics provided and you must add two other fabrics (to represent the "2"s in 2020). I will have bags available for pick up at the next meeting (no cost) that contain two fat 1/8<sup>th</sup> yards of fabric.
- The quilt must have at least two circles or "0"s somewhere on it (to represent the "0"s in 2020). These can be appliqued circles or circular shapes, circles in the additional two fabrics, or part of the quilting design.
- The quilt must contain 2 (and only 2) different quilt blocks. You may have as many or as few of these 2 blocks as you want, but you can't have more than 2 different quilt blocks.

For example, your quilt may be:

- 1 – 20" block with another block embedded in the large block (i.e. a second block in the center square or corner square of the 20" block)
- 5" blocks that alternate in a 4 x 4 set
- 4" blocks that alternate in a 5 x 5 set
- blocks with plain squares or sashing
- 10" blocks that alternate in a 2 x 2 set or with plain squares set 2 x 2
- an art quilt with 2 blocks featured somewhere within the design
- random sized blocks in a random setting

Please consider adding a 2" sleeve to the back (top) of your quilt and entering it in the 2021 quilt show. There will be a category for these quilts.

The quilts will be displayed at our November meeting. Members will vote on their favorite. The November speaker and I will vote on our favorites. Prizes will be awarded!

I look forward to your creativity and hope that you will accept my challenge!

**Monthly Tip – From Chris Hoover**

Everyone always talks about that ¼” seam allowance and the necessity of being accurate. But your seam allowance isn’t the only thing that needs to be accurate. When we start a quilt, the first thing we do is cut our fabrics. Don’t be lazy or rush through this step as this is the foundation to any quilt making. Take your time when cutting and remember: measure twice, cut once. I always cut out the largest pieces I need first so that if I make a mistake, I can usually trim those pieces down into smaller, useable pieces and I don’t waste quite as much fabric. Make sure to press your fabrics before you cut and as you are cutting, make sure to square up your fabrics again if they get a little wonky. If you aren’t accurate in this step, your seam ripper may become your best friend.

As usual, we will have everything we have had in the past: lots of quilts, lots of vendors, a raffle quilt and other great prizes, raffle baskets and other small items. New to the 2021 show: Linda Sullivan from Colourwerx will be our guest speaker/instructor.

The committee has started work on producing a fantastic show. But we need your help. We are asking each of you to do the following:

- 1) JOIN the guild in 2021. You must be a member of the guild to participate (display a quilt) in the 2021 show.
- 2) ENTER a quilt in the show! We hope that each of you will enter a quilt in the show. You have over a year to think about it.
- 3) MAKE a block for the raffle quilt. More information to follow about this opportunity at the next meeting.
- 4) SELL/BUY \$20 in raffle tickets. Again more information to follow. (You are going to want to win this raffle quilt.)
- 5) VOLUNTEER. We will be asking each of you to volunteer. There will be many opportunities before and during the show and we need your help.

The following positions are still open on our committee. If you are interested or want more information, please contact Renee Sauve or Chris Hoover.

**Publicity** – This will involve sending out postcards/bookmarks to quilt shops. Emailing flyers to guilds. Working with local print media. Working with our website chair to keep the quilt show page updated. Contacting local businesses to be sponsors of the show. Working with downtown restaurants on cross promotion. Working with our Quilt Show Facebook Page Coordinator.

**Raffle Quilt Travel Coordinator** – We want to take our raffle quilt on the road and we are looking for someone to coordinate the travel. This would require contacting guilds or event sponsors willing to let us show the quilt and sell raffle tickets and show tickets, keeping track of when and where the quilt needs to be and getting volunteers to travel with the quilt to these events.

The meeting was called to order at 5:15 by Chris Hoover. The February 2020 minutes were approved unanimously.

Treasurer Report (Diane Kremer): The February Treasurer Report was unanimously approved.

A discussion was held regarding the Guild creating a Resource List to be included on the Guild website to list people who have quilt-related businesses and who wish to provide their names and contact info. The Guild would not endorse the businesses/individuals but simply provide information. The Board generally felt positively about this.
