Don't forget to wear your nametags, so we get to know each other better. If you don't have one, please make one to wear at all SCHQ events.



Collage Appliqué Class

This class will be held on 2 separate Tuesday evenings; April 30th and May 7th from 5-9 pm at Salem Lutheran Church in St. Cloud. Melanie Schatz-Pattay will be teaching this technique so that participants will be able to create a vibrant wall hanging either from a kit or from your own pattern and fabric. Kits are available from Gruber's and she recommends starting with either the "Fiona the Featherweight" kit by Joan Cain, which makes a 28.5" by 27" wall hanging and costs \$57.50 or "Pincushion" which measures 41"x 45". The "Pincushion" pattern is \$30.25. A kit is yet to be developed for this pattern. Other kits are available, however, and you may choose what you'd like to make. The class is limited to 20 participants. The fee for the class is \$35. To register, contact Alice Sue Becker by email or by phone. QUILT SHOW 2019**Barb Corson & Marjorie La Tour**

How many quilts will you enter in the quilt show? Have you “made a list and are checking it twice”? The quilt registration form will be ready for you soon... the committee made a few final suggestions for changes at our last meeting and will be making the final approval soon.

The raffle tickets and quilt postcards are also being printed. We are waiting for final approval of the gambling license before releasing the raffle ticket for printing. We are sure that our beautiful quilt, “Pearls of the Sea” will generate lots of sales. The fabric was donated by Gruber’s Quilt Shop. The raffle ticket will include three additional prizes: Bernina 435 sewing machine from St. Cloud Sewing Center; Pfaff Passport 3.0 sewing machine from Just Sew Studio; and Baby Lock Jubilant sewing machine from Vacuum Center and Sewing Room. Be sure to thank these stores for their generous donations.

Vendors are sending in their reservations for booth space. With the change of date to the last weekend in September, there is some conflict with another show; however, we expect that we will still be able to fill our vendor space.

Start looking through your fabric collection for items you might want to donate for a raffle basket. Remember that you need not contribute an entire basket yourself – your donation can be paired with other items by the Raffle Basket Committee. Be sure to state the value of the items you are donating. This is required for reporting on our gambling license. Donation forms will be available at the next meeting.

Barb and Marjorie have issued a Co-Chair challenge: make a small quilt up to 36” x 36” that follows the theme of the show, “Pins to Pearls”. The size limit means that it could be a wall hanging, table topper, or a lap quilt. It can be either square or rectangular. Ideas to spark your creativity: pins, pincushions, safety pins, pearls, pearls on safety pins, sea, ocean, shells, sandy beach, quilt blocks such as Ocean Waves or Storm At Sea, or fabric featuring any of these images. One ribbon will be awarded to the quilt that best illustrates the theme.

Board Meeting Minutes – March 7, 2019

Minutes of the March 7, 2019 meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

BOARD REPORTS:

Special Events (Alice Sue Becker): Alice Sue is also working with Melanie Schatz-Pattay to offer a two session collage applique class. Dates will be April 30 and May 7th from 5-9 pm. Class size is limited to 15 and 5 have signed up. The teaching fee will be \$35. Members will bring their own pattern and fabric or kit. The location will be Salem Lutheran Church.

Small Groups (Karen Cyson): The first clue will be handed out at today's meeting. She will be combining 2 clues into one month to allow for the mystery quilt to be done this year.

Old Business Maggie is still looking for new pictures of quilts to display as headers on the website to change things up a bit. If you have a quilt you would like to share, send her a clear, close up picture.

New Business: There was a discussion about the bank fraud. We may want to bring in the police department to share with the guild ways to prevent email fraud.

Found old scrap books in storage. They will be given to the Historical Society



For over 30 years, the Quilters' Guild of ND hosted its annual Indian Summer Quilt Show every fall. In 2015 and 2016 after two different venues cancelled their contracts for the show (demolition of one venue and scheduling conflicts at the other venue) the Guild was challenged.

After a year of research and re-thinking, the Guild moved the quilt show to the spring of the year and inaugurated the Metro Quilt Expo.

Although the time of year is different, you'll still find 200+ quilts, fourteen merchant booths featuring fabric, books, patterns, notions, and sewing and quilting machines, free lectures and demonstrations, and a small quilt silent auction.

Be sure to join us for the 2019 Metro Quilt Expo scheduled May 4 and 5 at the Ramada Fargo, 3333 13th Ave S. Hours are 9 am - 6 pm Friday and 9 am - 5 pm Saturday.
