## Sandy Anderson

**Eunice Hill** grew up on a farm in Minnesota. Her first project was an embroidery cross stitch of an elephant that she did in kindergarten. She learned to sew clothing at age nine. By high school, Eunice was making her entire wardrobe, including wool suits, coats and her prom dress.

She made her first quilt in 1958. Sewing was put on hold until the early 1970s, when she first learned about quilt blocks. There were no quilt stores or classes, and very few quilting books available, so Eunice was self-taught. She admired the work of Jinny Beyer after seeing Ray of Light, The Great American Quilt Winner in 1977.

Eunice never dreamed where quilting would take her. Today, she creates original designs and patterns, and is a retired American Quilter's Society appraiser. Her quilts have been published in books and calendars, and won prizes in the Paducah Show. In 2004, she was named Minnesota Quilter of the Year.

At one time, it took Eunice over 17 years to finish a quilt for her son. She is now a compulsive "finish the project" gal. She enjoys teaching and doing commission quilts for others. "For me, quilting is playing with color and fabrics—what fun!" she says.

### SERVICE PROJECTS- 2018

Cheryl Peters-Lewis and Karen Abfalter spoke at our May 3 meeting about their organization, **Recovery Plus**, and the need for **twin size quilts for boys and girls between the ages of 12 and 18**. The average stay at Recovery Plus is 6 weeks, and those staying there take their quilts with them when they leave. It was an interesting and educational talk.

Lisa Schroers, from **Pockets of Hope**, will speak at the June meeting. Pockets of Hope provides backpacks for children placed in foster care. Backpacks are filled with comfort items such as quilts, dolls or teddy bears, and flashlights and books. This will be the organization we will focus on for June/July, and the need is for **toddler quilts**.

A big THANK YOU to all who have helped with cutting, assembling, and sewing cancer bags!

To date, in 2018, we have received the following for service projects:

Coborn's Cancer Center – 295 bags Stearns County Health Dept. – 15 Tummy Time playmats Eagle's Nest – 4 placemats and 2 wall hangings Anna Marie's shelter – 1 twin quilt (girl) Recovery Plus – 2 twin quilts

You can turn in service project items at any meeting, for any organization, throughout 2018. Thank you for your generosity!!

The project highlighted in August will be **Coborn's Cancer Center patient bags**. These are bags given to cancer patients with a variety of personal and comfort items. Dates for cutting and sewing the bags will be scheduled.

In September/October we will focus on **Eagle's Nest**, a home for Veterans, located in Sauk Centre (<u>www.eagleshealingnest.com</u>). **Twin-size bed quilts (60 x 80 or 65 x 85)** are needed. Veterans may take the quilt with them when they leave. **Pillowcases** that match the quilts are welcomed, as well as **seasonal wall hangings**, and **every day and seasonal table runners** (24" square or 4' long).

Projects for November and December will include **Quilts of Valor**, and **twin and full size quilts** are needed. More information will be coming. Other organizations may be added around the holidays.

The above list of projects should give members an idea of what they might like to work on throughout the year, if they choose to participate. All of the above projects can be worked on and completed at any time during 2018 and brought to any of the guild meetings.
