Quilt Show: "Pins to Pearls"



We are nearing the dates for our quilt show – only six weeks away as I write the update. Raffle ticket sales at Gruber’s have been excellent, with many sales being made as buses come in during the Quilt MN Shop Hop. A huge thank you to all who have been volunteering to sell raffle tickets, especially Sandy Anderson who has spent many hours there selling tickets. **Remember to turn in your raffle tickets and \$\$, both sold and unsold tickets, by our next meeting on Sept. 5.** We need to send in a preliminary report to the state Gambling Board prior to the show. If you have plans to sell more in September, before the quilt show, then you may keep your **unsold** tickets. **However, all tickets must be turned in prior to the drawing at the quilt show.**

Here are some other reminders:

1. Send in your quilt registrations by our next meeting, September 5. You will still have three weeks to finish your quilts before the show. Remember that your quilts need to be in a pillowcase with a label. We will share more information on how to do this at our September meeting.
2. Sign up to volunteer. The quilt show would not be possible without your help. If you will not be at the September meeting, contact Kathryn Stolpman or Deb Van Vleet to offer your time. There are many jobs that allow you to sit during your volunteer time.
3. Sign up to have your quilt(s) appraised. You need to fill out a Quilt Appraisal Request and schedule a time for your appraisal. Contact Marjorie for the Appraisal Request Form and schedule a time.
4. Bring your raffle basket donations to the September meeting.
5. Don't forget about your challenge quilts – President's Challenge, Quilt Show Challenge, and Small Group Challenge
6. Do you have young children that like to sew? Help them finish a quilt to enter in the children's section of the show.
7. Tell all your friends and family about the show and encourage them to attend.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:23 PM.

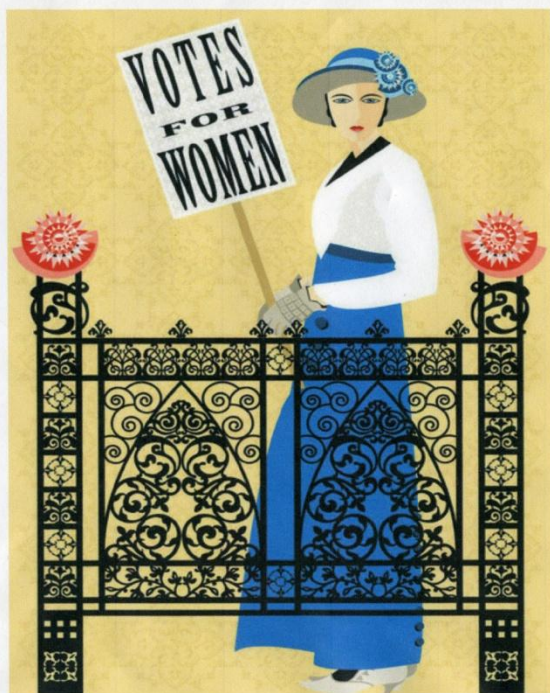
