Monthly Tip - Chris Hoover

One of those things that quilters hate to do is mitering a border. But we do love the look – especially if we are using a border stripe. There are all kinds of videos and instructions out there for this process (I have listed a couple links below). I agree with the sewing instructions, just not necessarily the cutting instructions as you will see...

I have a few quirks when I sew (my husband would say many, but I'm just talking quilting now) and one of them is wasting fabric. The first time I mitered a border, I followed instructions that said to allow 4 – 8" over the length of the borders you cut (depending on the size of your border). And yes, it worked, but oh, what a waste! So, I tried to come up with a better formula to precut my borders that didn't waste as much fabric.

I love the Easy Angle™ ruler – mainly because you don't waste fabric. It's also a very versatile ruler and great for mitering corners. [There are comparable rulers out there if you don't have this one: Creative Grids 45° Half Square Triangle ruler, Nifty Notions 45° Half Square Triangle ruler, Folded Corner Ruler, Simple Folded Corner ruler...] So, here's my formula for cutting borders with little waste using this type of ruler: (Note: finished size does not include seam allowances and ALWAYS measure twice before you cut!)

Formula

Width of Quilt = A

Length of Quilt = B

Finished size of border = C

Side border length to cut: $B + C + C$

Top/Bottom border length to cut: $A + C + C$

Example

A = 24 ½"

B = 36 ½"

C = 4" (border is cut 4 ½")

$36 ½" + 4" + 4" = 44 ½"$

$24 ½" + 4" + 4" = 32 ½"$

Now, follow the pictures...

1) I fold my border strips in half as shown with the fold to the left. Placing the ruler so that the flat tip is even with the short end of the strip and the side of the ruler is even with the bottom edge of the strip, I trim along the diagonal edge of the ruler. Those tiny triangles are the only wasted fabric.☺ Repeat for each border.



2) Now to the sewing... Pin the short side of the border as shown in the photo. First, I find the center of the border strip and the center of the quilt and pin. Next, I place a pin through the border at each corner ¼" from the edges and through the quilt ¼" from each edge. Then I pin the length of the border to the quilt top.



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3) Sew the border to the quilt starting and stopping $\frac{1}{4}$ " in from each end, backstitching a couple of stitches.



4) When sewing the next border, pin as you see here, making sure the sewn border is folded back out of the way. Continue sewing each border to the sides of the quilt.



5) To sew the ends of the borders together, fold the quilt wrong sides together so that the seamed border edges are even. Your trimmed corners will line up as you see here and the quilt will be out of the way of your sewing.



6) Sew in a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam, starting $\frac{1}{4}$ " in (where the border seams end), be sure to backstitch and sew to the outer corner. In my photo I started sewing at the top.



7) I press my border seams out away from the quilt center. I usually press them after I have all the borders sewn to the quilt center. The corner seams I press whichever way they want to go. [This is not what most recommend for pressing, but what works for me.]



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8) And there you have it – a beautiful quilt with lovely mitered borders. 😊
