### **Guidelines for the Granite City Challenge**

Following are the guidelines for creating a quilt for the Special Display for the Minnesota Quilter's Show next June.

Choose a traditional block (one that has a name like Log Cabin, Dresden Plate, Irish Chain, New York Beauty, or Ohio Star). This block is what your design will be based on.

The quilt must finish at 24" x 24" with a binding.

Make one block or more to fit within the finished size of 24" x 24". If you make more than one block, they all have to be the same block, but can be different sizes or the same size. You could make a collage of different sizes of one block to fill the space. You can change the block by making it wonky, twist it, abstract it, or use different fabrics than were used traditionally for that block.

You may add applique, buttons, trapunto, or add other objects, as long as they don't stick out more than 1/2".

You may include sashing between the blocks. You can float your block or blocks on a wide border or multiple borders, or not have a border at all

You must make a quilt with 3 layers and quilting of some variety, hand or machine, to hold the layers together.

The fabric you received from the guild must be used for the binding and you must use at least one square inch of this special fabric within your quilt. You may not color, paint, dye or stitch over this fabric to change it or cover it up. It must be easily visible on the quilt.

Attach a 4-inch hanging sleeve to the back of the quilt.

Members present: Marilyn Bujalski (secretary), Karen Cyson (special events), Terri Bahn (program chair, Kathy Crabtree (small groups), Mary Proell (treasurer), Marlyn Anderson (president), Marie Zaczkowski (newsletter), Cindy Kleve (service projects), Mary Proell (co-treasurer)

Meeting was called to order at 5:45 pm by Marlyn Anderson.

Motion by Karen, second by Marie, to approve October minutes. Motion carried by majority vote of all members present.

**BOARD REPORTS:**

**Special Events** (Karen Cyson) Karen will have sign-up sheets for both the basket class and the teaching workshop at the meeting.

**Programs** (Terri Bahn): Anita Schultz and her husband are doing a program tonight on "now that I've finished it, what do I do with it". Three speakers have been booked for next year for January, February, and March. Terri would like input on what she should do for the Christmas party. Karen said not to do the dice game again. Other suggestions were made. Terri will look for some fun games.

**Service Projects** (Cindy Kleve): Cindy said Jean Euteneuer has volunteered to do the service projects for next year. Quilts of Valor will be continued. There were a lot of really nice comments about the presentation last month. Karen related a touching story about how this ceremony helped a military family. Cindy has 78 Gifts for Giving items so far. She will continue to collect them through December. Some will be given to Good Shepherd nursing home and to Anna Marie's Shelter. The next quilt show board meeting will be in January.

**Membership** (Fawn Wright): Fawn noted that there are currently 165 members. In January the membership will start over again for the new year. Memberships not paid by the end of the February meeting will be dropped from the list. Nine new members were signed up during our promotion. It was suggested that we extend the promotion to the end of the year to simplify things. After discussion, it was decided that this should be a policy instead of revisiting it every year. Motion by Cindy, second by Karen, to have a membership promotion each year from October through December. Motion carried by majority vote of all members present. Fawn commented that she purchased some new wooden circles to use for the door prize drawing because the poker chips were sticking together too much. Fawn has large supply of old guild pins and wants to know what to do with them. Board suggested giving them away to new members and just putting them on the table for people to pick up.

**Newsletter** (Marie Zaczkowski): Marie has begun looking at Constant Contact. She wants to find if there are other ways the program can be used, possibly as part of the website.

Fawn noted that she had not been given a budget so had no idea of how much was available for her to spend. Mary told Fawn it was included in the second budget detail. No one had a copy of the second budget to review. It was stated that board members should get approval from entire board if they will be spending more than was suggested in the budget. More work will need to be done to provide members with an up to date accounting of expenses for both the quilt show and the guild. Some suggestions were made to include the specific committee on the expense vouchers to eliminate some confusion.

**President** (Marlyn Anderson, Terri Olson): Marlyn told the board that a 4 inch sleeve will need to be put on all the Granite City challenge quilts for hanging at the Duluth show. She will announce this at the meeting.

**Adjournment:** Motion by Terri Bahn, second by Marlyn Anderson to adjourn. Motion carried by majority vote of all members present. Meeting was adjourned at 6:34pm.

If you are creating a block for the raffle quilt, you were given the pattern and black background fabric. You will need to supply your own jewel-toned batik fabric for the leaf colors. (Please do not use any other black than what was given to you. If you need more, please contact us). **Blocks are to measure 9 1/2" square (unfinished) and must be returned by the December guild meeting.**

There have been questions about what colors can be used for the jewel toned leaves. Here is an image of the quilt we are creating to help you in selecting colors. As you can see, they do not have to be just fall colors. Be sure to use your best workmanship in creating your block(s).
