Anna Marie's Alliance was highlighted in April. Anna Marie's is a women's shelter that needs twin-size quilts for boys, girls, and women. These are often taken with them when a family leaves the shelter.

Clara's House/Recovery Plus were the organizations highlighted in May. Twin-size quilts are needed for children ages 12-18 from Clara's House, who stay at Recovery Plus for 6-8 weeks. They can take these quilts with them and are often the first quilt they have owned.

Pockets of Hope is a program where children entering foster care are given backpacks with comfort items, including a blanket of some sort. This was the organization we focused on for June/July, and the need is for toddler quilts.

The project highlighted in August was Coborn's Cancer Center patient bags. These are bags given to cancer patients with a variety of personal and comfort items.

Projects for November and December include Quilts of Valor and Eagle's Healing Nest, and twin and full size are needed.

Board Meeting Minutes – November 1, 2018

Meeting called to order at 6:15 p.m. by Marjorie LaTour. All board members present except Sandy Anderson, Karen Cyson, Lois Rieffer and Marie Zaczkowski.

1. October meeting minutes approved. Motion made by Elaine, seconded by Ann.

Board Reports:

a. President: none

b. Program Chair: Demonstrations on fabric painting to be held at tonight's general meeting. All members are to bring potholders or mug rugs to December meeting for an exchange.

c. Membership: 150 current members. Dues for 2019 are due now.

d. Treasurer: October Report: Income: Birthday Fabric \$82.53; Refreshments \$10; Membership \$25.00. Total income: \$117.55 Expenses: 2 books for library \$34.35; Check from 2017 to Dave Holmes cashed \$50.00. Total expenses: \$84.35

End of October Bank Totals: Guild checking: \$3,472.30; Show checking: \$198.50; Guild savings: \$4,582.95 CD: \$20,164.99

Guidelines to Reduce Taxes:

1. Non-Quilt Show Years:

a. Donate appropriate funds to service projects designated for the year.

b. Donate appropriate amount for door prizes at Christmas party.

2. Quilt Show Years:

a. Same.

b. Same.

Objective: To reduce taxes in Show year per tax accountant (10/29/2018)

1. Federal only: For every \$1000.00 in expenses, it will reduce taxes by \$150.00.

2. Federal and State combined: For every \$1000.00 in expenses, it will reduce taxes by \$250.00

Example: 2017 taxable income was \$7,120.00. We paid Federal \$1068.00 and State \$717.00. If our profit remained approximately the same, we could have between \$3000.00 and \$4000.00 in additional taxes. Goal would be to reduce our total taxes between \$750.00 - \$1000.00

e. Small Groups - No Report

f. Service Projects - Tally to be given at general meeting. Representatives from Eagles Healing Nest to speak tonight. Tally: 521 cancer bags, 53 tummy time mats. Quilts: 15 to Anna Marie's; 11 to Recovery Plus; 41 to Pockets of Hope; 21 to Eagles Nest plus table runners and placemats.

g. Special Events/Librarian - October Sip, Swap and Sew was held October 23rd and attended by 7 people. A soup and potluck supper was held, the swap was a trick or treat event and Marlyn Anderson won the costume contest. The next Triple S event will be in February 2019. Two workshops are being researched and planned for 2019. One is on free motion quilting and the second is on collage appliqué.
