PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello all,

As my garden winds down and my arm continues healing, I had to opportunity last week to sneak into my sewing room for a day or two! The hubster and our 2 sons took off for 2 days fishing and I have to tell you I loved it :)

I decided it was time to clean since I can't use my rotary cutter for too long yet. So, I looked at the overflowing mound of scraps and decided to dig in. After a full evening in my sewing room pitching, organizing, ironing and sorting I am down to 4 small but manageable piles to cut into strips and squares. Two years ago, we had a local speaker talk about her scrap quilts and how she organized her scraps. I dug in at that time and busted huge piles into 2.5", 3.5", 4.5", and 5.5" squares, plus 2.5" strips. There are also 1.5" and some odd pieces but it is all organized into clear small totes by size and color. I have to tell you I have used and used and used those bins for a bit of this and that and to make some wonderful quilts. I make a lot of charity quilt tops for Lutheran World Relief so those busted scraps make it easy to add and finish tops. Larger pieces of fabric, that fabric you bought and no longer "love it" and orphan blocks go into a big charity tote as well. Now, my quilt room looks clean and ready, if only my arm would catch up! It really is healing well, just pressure (aka rotary cutter) and twisting make it quite sore.

September brings us closer to what I call quilt season! I don't sew very much at all in the summer so I am feeling the itch to get out of the garden and kitchen (massive canning season going on) and back to the creative side of life. I am looking forward to seeing each of you at the September meeting in person or virtually. We will again offer a Zoom link to watch. It works okay, not perfect, but at least we can still gather! September 2nd Program (Meeting In-person and Virtually via Zoom)

Our speaker for September is Heather Peterson of Anka's Treasures. Heather is the designer and owner behind Anka's Treasures. She started her business as a college sophomore in 1996. Since that time, she has published numerous single patterns and more than 30 books. Her work has been published in popular quilting magazines, and she was honored as the Quilter of the Year in 2019 by the Minnesota Quilters state guild. Heather has a new fabric line and patterns coming out in October, so come and hear all about what is new at Anka's Treasures.

**Paper Bag Quilt Top Project - Want to participate?**

A paper bag quilt top is similar to a 'Round Robin quilt project. The center block (any size) is created by you, placed in a paper bag to hide its design and passed on to another participating member who adds to your block, increasing its size and adding to the design. The quilt is returned to the paper bag and passed to a different (6 in all) member from month to month. Meanwhile - you are adding to the other members quilt tops.

After six months the "big reveal" takes place and the owner of the initial block gets their quilt top back with the contributions of 5 other members.

We need at least 6 members to participate. So far, we have 2 members interested. If you would like to join in the fun, (or have questions) please contact Pam Rickbeil or Julie Johnson or bring a quilt block in a paper bag to September's meeting to get the project started.

Workshop with Heidi Pridemore - November 5th, 9 am to 4 pm

St. Cloud Heritage Quilters will host a workshop with Heidi Pridemore of Whimsical Workshop. Heidi will teach “Rippling Waves”. Cost for guild members is \$40.



How many projects with curves have you passed up since it involves sewing curves? Heidi will help you learn to cut and sew curves quickly and easily in this class. You will never pass up a curved project again.

Now on to bias triangles, this project is made with Creative Grids Cat’s Cradle XL ruler, that takes all the triangles out of the process. Each block is made from rectangles and squares.

In this class we will spend the first half cutting out several curved blocks and go over the traditional and ruler method for the Cat’s Cradle blocks. The second half of the class we will sew our curves and blocks together.
