## Twelve Block Kid Quilt Top Instructions



To sew the blocks:

1. Using a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam, sew the $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle to $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Press the seam open or towards darker fabric. Repeat with remaining 11 sets.
2. Again using a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam, add the $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 161 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ piece along the long end of the piece from step 1. Press as above. Repeat with remaining 11 sets.
3. Layout the quilt in the $3 \times 4$ block pattern. You can make it as random or ordered as you'd like! Collect the blocks into the 4 rows

For the borders:
Sub-cut one of the border sections into (4) squares for the cornerstones. (equal $\mathrm{h} \times \mathrm{w}$ )
4. Using (3) border sections \& (2) cornerstones, sew together the border strip for the top of the quilt, beginning \& ending with a cornerstone. Press seams to the right.
5. Sew rows 1-4 together, beginning \& ending each row with a border section.
6. Press rows $1 \& 3$ to the left; rows $2 \& 4$ to the right.
7. Repeat step 4 for the bottom border. Press to the left.
8. Sew top border to row $1 \&$ sew bottom border to row 4.

Blocks (12) are made from 1 each of

- $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle
- $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square
- $61 / 21 \times 161 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle

The kid-size top layout is


- 3 blocks across $\longleftrightarrow$ (rows)
- 4 blocks down $\underset{\downarrow}{f}$ (columns)


Please give the front of the top a nice press \& either backstitch or stay stitch (scant $1 / 4$ ") all seams on outside edges.
